

Edison Mission Group Corporate Profile

Edison Mission Group (EMG) manages the competitive power generation business and other unregulated subsidiaries of Edison International (NYSE: EIX). EMG is headquartered in Irvine, Calif.

Generation

EMG's continuing operations consist of owned or leased interests in 39 power generation facilities, with an operating capacity of 10,072 megawatts.



EMG's power generation assets include fossil-fuel power plants in California, Illinois, Pennsylvania, Washington, West Virginia and Doga, Turkey, and a biomass facility in New York.

EMG has one of the largest portfolios of wind energy projects in the U.S. with 27 projects currently in operation or under construction in Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, Nebraska, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Texas, Utah and Wyoming. EMG is working through joint development agreements to advance wind projects in additional states, including Illinois, Maryland, New York, West Virginia and Wisconsin.

Energy Trading

Edison Mission Energy (EME), a subsidiary of EMG also based in Irvine, Calif., is an independent power producer engaged in the business of owning, leasing, operating and selling energy and capacity from electric power generation facilities. EME conducts price risk management and energy trading activities through Edison Mission Marketing and Trading, which is based in Boston.



Merchant Power

Headquartered in Chicago, EMG subsidiary Midwest Generation operates six coal-fired electric power generating plants in Illinois. Another EMG company operates the coal-fired Homer City Generating Station in western Pennsylvania.



The Midwest Generation and Homer City plants are merchant plants, producing power that is not committed to be sold under long-term contracts. Most of these plants' output is sold into the PJM (Pennsylvania-Jersey-Maryland) marketplace, a 13-state region which extends from the Atlantic coast westward to Illinois.

EMG subsidiary Edison Mission Operations and Maintenance (EMOM) operates nine generating facilities fueled by natural gas in California and a waste coal plant in West Virginia.

EMOM also operates EMG's wind energy projects across the country. Power from these facilities is sold under contracts with various utilities or into competitive regional power markets.

Energy Capital

The capital and financial services business of EMG is managed by the Irvine, Calif.-based Edison Capital subsidiary, which has investments worldwide in energy and infrastructure projects, including power generation, electric transmission and distribution, transportation and telecommunications. Edison Capital also has investments in affordable housing projects located throughout the United States.
